

The MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (hereinafter referred to as MOU) is made between Chartered International Da Vinci University (CIDVU), Delaware, USA and ITM University, Gwalior, Madhya Pradesh, INDIA

Chartered International Da Vinci University (CIDVU), Delaware, USAis globally recognized University by the Ministry of Education, United States of America (hereinafter called First Party) offers professional, technical and vocational study programs along with facilities for research in higher education. Da Vinci University, Delaware is member of International Association of Transnational Universities (IATU). United Kingdom

Chartered Intl. Da Vinci University is duly incorporated under the International Laws of 1704,1776 and 1787 in United States of America at Office of First State (State of Delaware) with chartered file number: 5699203 as a worldwide recognized global teaching and research private university with International Trade Mark registered of logo with an international trademark order in United States of America. And Official Partner of United Nations Global Compact and properly Accredited, Registered and Licensed with the following bodies: Council for Higher Education Accreditation in USA, Ministry of Education, United States of America, Board of Quality Standards (UK), in collaboration with The International Network for Quality Assurance Agencies in Higher Education (INQAAHE) as a full registered member which head offices located in Spain which is an International Quality Assurance body that works closely as a recognized body with National Accreditation bodies worldwide such as Council for Higher Education Accreditation in USA, Department of Education, USA, European Association for Quality Assurance in Higher Education in Europe, National Accreditation Board, Ghana and other accreditation bodies in Africa countries with other academicians to control educational quality in around over 140 countries., it's also a world-wide association of near 300 organizations active in the theory and practice of quality assurance in higher education, International Association Transnational Universities, United Kingdom.

Da Vinci University is a member of registered participant of International Association of Universities (IAU) Conference which is an official partner of UNESCO. The IAU secretariat is based in Paris and is located at the headquarters of UNESCO.

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ITM University, Gwalior, Madhya Pradesh, INDIA will be the Second Party on the OTHER PART (who for the purpose of this MOU) are hereinafter individually referred to as PARTIES. ITM University, Gwalior, Madhya Pradesh, INDIA is a fully government recognised and approved private state University under Section 2(f) of University Grants Commission (UGC) Act, 1956. ITM University, Gwalior, Madhya Pradesh has been empowered by University Grants Commission has to award the professional, technical and vocational degrees under UGC Act 1956. ITM University, Gwalior is accredited by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) and ranked by National Institute of Ranking Framework (NIRF), Govt. of India. All offering programs of ITM University, Gwalior, Madhya Pradesh are approved by respective Council and Commission such as All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE), Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR), Council of Architecture (CA), Pharmacy Council of India (PCI) and Madhya Pradesh Nurses Registration Council (MPNRC), Indian Nursing Council (INC), National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE), BAR Council of India. M.P. Paramedical Council and MP Private University Regulatory Commission.

DECLARATION FOR MoU

The parties having discussed fields of common research interests and allied academic activities between the two institutions have decided to enter into long-term collaboration for promotion of students training and quality graduate and postgraduate research in cutting edge areas.





- I. That both Universities have common cultural, technical, educational and scientific fields of interest. After mutual consent along with signatures and seal of both Universities on this MoU, news preferably with group photos of authorities and staff must be published in some of newspapers for its validity and authenticity.
- II. That the collaboration and exchange of experience and knowledge, as well as the provision of services between both Universities, are mutually beneficial for the social and cultural progress of the Universities.

OBJECTIVES OF THE AGREEMENT

The objective of this agreement is to establish an action plan for the collaboration both Universitiesthrough specific project activities of mutual interest to improve academic, scientific and cultural cooperation relations, as well as the exchange of teaching staff, researchers and students, publications, academic programs and research projects between the two institutions.

The objectives of the MoU will include programs offered at either party which are felt to be desirable and feasible for the development and strengthening of expertise in the various fields to expand the opportunities in the research, especially translational research and industrial collaboration, besides the development of human resources to face the future challenges & the cooperative relationships between the two institutions.

It also includes the exchange of ideas on research publications, academic programs and research projects and promotion of technology, incubation and startups".

Such programs may include any or all of the following activities:

- I) Encouragement of study by qualified students, both graduate and undergraduate, of each party of order;
- II) Exchange of faculty and researchers;
- III) Promotion of collaborative research in areas of mutual interest;





- IV) Development of short-term academic and training programs
- V) Participation of jointly organized academic meetings, seminars, and workshops;
- VI) Academic Programs / Degree Certificates of Master's, Doctorate (Ph.D./D.Phil. /DBA) and Post-Doctorate (D.Litt./D.Sc./LLD) may be sued jointly with dual certification in the interest of students, research scholars and the collaborative Universities.
- VII) By either party/University an Honorary Causa Doctoral Ph.D./DBA/D.Phil.and Post-Doctoral Degrees D.Litt./D.Sc./LLD.may be awarded / offered jointly to deserving and eminent scholars and academicians based on merit in view of their significant contributions in their specialized area/subject evidenced by academic credentials, achievements and research publications in global journals of international repute. Only in case of any discrepancies the respective Vice-Chancellors of collaborative Universities may jointly decide and approve or disapprove amicably.
- VII) Any other areas which the parties agree are in their mutual interest.

ARTICLE 1: Scope, Goals and Forms of Cooperation

The signing institutes / universities agree to provide opportunity as appropriate for the following activities towards the completion of the objectives of this MOU:

- Exchange of ideas with the objective of offering course and realizing research
 projects in areasmutually agreed upon by both parties through prior invitation
 and in accordance with the procedures and expectations established by each
 institute and specific department.
- II. The First party will provide research guide and support in various fields as on the demand of second party for conducting research related to the thesis dissertation requirements of the research students.

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- III. Operational details of research effort and collaboration will be made in common research programs and/or projects restricted to specific mandated domain within the approved disciplines divisions.
- IV. Research instrumentation facility and library facilities available with the Second party and the First party will be made available to the faculty and research scholars. However, the costs of specific consumables will be borne by the respective organizations.
- V. Exchange of scientific publications, study programs, academic projects, course information, seminars, conferences, and any other data and information of common interest.
- VI. Both the Institutions will develop joint research projects; promote incubation technology, startups, organization of seminars, symposia, workshops for benefits of the students.
- VII. Submitting proposals jointly to various Central/State Department Organization under different Schemes using each other's competencies by mutual consent.
- VIII. All joint activities will be realized through the mutual agreement and clearly established conditions and mutual obligations of the appropriate institute entity.

ARTICLE 2: Management

- I. Executive Vice-Chancellor or Vice-Chancellor of the First party and Vice-Chancellor of Second party will be responsible to work out operational details of co-operation between the two organizations and ensure proper and effective implementation of this MOU. If required in some urgent cases the Pro-Vice Chancellor or Vice Chancellor (In-Charge/ Officiating) will be responsible to work out operational details of co-operation between the two organizations.
- II. The Advisory Committee will meet at least once in a year alternatively in the institution of First party and the Second party to review the activities. This

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meeting shall include presentation on the academic and research activities, which should be open to all students, faculties and scientists.

ARTICLE 3: Exchange of Information

- The term "information includes scientific or technical data results and/or methods of investigation, and other information intended to be provided, exchanged, or arising under project descriptions entered into pursuant to this MOU.
- II. The parties support the widest possible dissemination of information. Each party in joint projects shall be given the right to use, disclose, publish or disseminate such information for any and all purposes.

ARTICLE 4: Implementation of the Memorandum of Understanding

- It is understood that the First party and Second party subscribe to the principle of equal opportunity and do not discriminate on the basis of state, race, sex, age, cast or religion. Both the institutions shall abide by these principles in the administration of this agreement and neither party shall impose criteria for exchange of scholars or students, which violate principles of non-discrimination.
- II. Students and research scholars may visit the corresponding departments of the institute afterfinalizing a mutually acceptable schedule.
- III. All the expenses shall be the direct responsibility of the concerned student(s) (subject to any agreements on payment arrangements made by either institution with its own students).
- IV. The researchers will be allowed to make use of the instruments and research facilities available in various departments of these institutes after prior approval of the visiting schedule and due approval from Heads of Institutes.

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V. Both partiespromote research and realize collaborative projects giving priority to interdisciplinary works.

ARTICLE 5: Terms and Conditions

- I. This MOU shall become effective from the date it is signed by the parties and shall be valid for three years extendable up to five years. Both parties shall review the status of the MOU at the end of each three/five-year period to determine any modification, whenever necessary. The period of validity of this MOU may be extended by mutual consent up to next five years. This MOU may be amended by mutual written agreement and may be terminated at any time by either party upon written notification signed by the competent authority of the party initiating termination. Such notification must be given to the other party at least six months in advance from the effective date of termination.
- II. All joint activities not completed at the expiration or termination of the MOU may be continued until their completion under the terms of this MOU.
- III. No amendment or modification of the MOU shall be valid unless the same is made in writing by both the parties or their authorized representatives and specifically stating the same for amendment of the MOU. The modifications/changes shall become part of the MOU and shall be effective from the date on which they are made/executed unless otherwise agreed.
- IV. Financial terms and conditions will be decided mutually as per needs of both parties. This MOU will be considered only for academic and R&D purposes by both parties. Partnership Certificate will be issued after published news.

ARTICLE 6: Arbitration

 Any issues that are not addressed or stipulated in the MoU shall be discussed and resolved through negotiation in good faith and such resolution will be

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incorporated as written amendments to the MoU by mutual agreement between both Parties.

II. No disputes are foreseen in the implementation of the MoU. The two Parties, however, agree that if any dispute arises between them, efforts will be made to settle the same as amicably as possible. If the dispute still remains unsettled, it will be referred for resolution bilaterally to Executive Vice Chancellor/ Vice Chancellor, Chartered Intl.Da Vinci University, Delaware, USA and Vice Chancellor, ITM University, Gwalior, India. The decisions so arrived at shall be final and binding on the parties to this MoU.
